- To have fun and do a good job with your cat project, you will need to give your cat lots of attention. If you give your cat plenty of understanding and affection, it will give you affection and love in return. The 4-H cat project accepts all cats, household pets or purebreds. Always keep in mind that the cat must be safe to handle for the owner/handler and the judge. If you do not already have a cat, you must decide what kind to get. Kittens are playful and fun to watch. They are easy to train and adjust to a new home and family fairly quickly. Older cats will be quieter than kittens and already trained, but need more time to become used to their new home and owner.

Project Requirements

Cat Project members who intend to exhibit their animal(s) at the Adams County Fair must complete the following to remain eligible for fair entry and exhibition:

1. Enroll in the Cats Project by the enrollment deadline (found under 'activities' in 4-H Online).
2. Complete and file an Animal Care and Housing Form on 4HOnline by deadline.
3. ID all animals in 4HOnline by June 1 deadline (project cat must be owned by ID deadline)
4. Attend Animal Record Book Interviews and present an up-to-date E-Record Book.
5. Enter fair classes online by deadline.
6. Your cat must meet the vaccination requirements to be eligible to enter in the County Fair. (see premium book)
7. Complete and turn in E-Record book the Friday following Labor Day to the Extension Office.

Additional Information - Animal Entry in 4-H Online

1. Beginning in 2016 - 4-H members will be required to enter their animals in the 4-H Online enrollment system. This page will help summarize the information required in this system.
2. All Cat project animals must be entered in the 4-H Online system no later than June 1st of the current project year.
3. It is highly recommended any and all animals with the potential of attending Fair have ID in 4HOnline. if an animal does not have ID, it will not be allowed at Fair.
